FULL FUEL TANK, SECURE LOOSE ITEMS, KNOW YOUR CONTROLS, CHECK RADIO OPERATIONS.



PROPER SIGNAGE ON VEHICLES

- SLOW MOVING VEHICLE SYMBOL (TRIANGLE)
- STAY BACK 100' SIGN ON THE BACK

MUST BE IN GOOD CONDITION,
REFLECTIVE, AND CLEAN.
REMOVE SNOW AND/OR DIRT.
