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

Pathfinder Program in West Virginia

Goal of strengthening the working relationship between WV DOH and the NWS/Weather & Climate Enterprise so that travelers can make well informed, safe and efficient travel decisions.

- Increased coordination between TMC and NWS weekly and then leading up to, during and after winter storms.
- Coordinating messaging for DMS Message Boards across the state.
- Better sharing of information such as snowfall accumulations and road conditions.

Partly cloudy tonight. Lows in the low 30s.






- Each model has it's own biases.
- Each model
 performs differently
 from storm to storm
 depending on how
 well atmosphere is
 sampled.
- New model runs come in every 12 hours to as often as every hour.
- Models often show big winter storms out in the future only to lose it in time. Don't trust just one model run!







Snow falls out of clouds into cold air aloft and...

...melts to rain in a deep layer of warm air that extends down to the surface.

...melts to rain in a warm layer aloft, then freezes into glaze ice upon contact with cold surfaces.


...melts in a warm layer aloft, then refreezes into ice pellets in a layer of cold air above the surface.

...remains snow in the absence of any warm layer of air aloft.

Upper Air Balloon Launch Locations







To get a forecast right, we have to now only get the surface forecast right, but also the forecast above the ground right.

1 or 2 degrees 5,000 feet above the ground may mean the difference between a foot of snow, or 1" of cold rain (and a bunch of unhappy school kids/teachers).















WINTER STORM WATCH

Significant winter weather is possible



Monitor the latest forecast and be prepared!

within the next few days.

WINTER STORM WARNING

Severe winter weather is occurring/imminent



Take necessary precautions and avoid travel!

WINTER WEATHER ADVISORY

Expect some travel difficulties



Snow/ice amounts will not meet warning criteria but will cause travel problems.

Exercise caution, especially if you must travel!

Media broadcasts our watches, warnings and advisories, but does not have to agree with our forecast.

Snow Squalls: Brief, intense snow showers accompanied by strong, gusty winds. Accumulation may be significant in a short period of time and visibility can be reduced to near zero.






Why the impacts?

Temperatures rapidly fall below freezing during the snow showers.

While the snow initially melts on contact with the pavement, it then quickly refreezes as the temperatures plummet, creating a layer of black ice.


Drivers are often unprepared for the quick changes in driving conditions.





Snow Squall Potential Awareness

- When forecasters are confident of snow squall warning occurrence, it will be mentioned in the Hazardous Weather Outlook.
- We will also use social media to highlight the potential for Snow Squalls.
- Snow Squall Warning will be issued to warn of well organized snow squalls appearing on radar.
 - Polygon format similar to Severe Thunderstorm Warnings.
 - In effect for 30-60 minutes with a 30 minute lead time goal.
 - Will include information on exits/mile markers affected on Interstates and major highways

IMPACT...Dangerous life-threatening travel.

* The dangerous snow squall will be near...

Caroline and <u>Slaterville</u> Springs around 350 PM EST. Berkshire, Richford and Harford around 355 PM EST. Whitney Point and Lisle around 405 PM EST. Marathon around 410 PM EST. Willet and East Freetown around 415 PM EST.

PRECAUTIONARY/PREPAREDNESS ACTIONS...

Conditions will deteriorate rapidly with near zero visibilities in snow and blowing snow. Travel will become impossible. You should wait until the squall passes before traveling or find a safe place to wait out the squall away from any road or highway indoors if traveling.













